Course Description

Teneriffe lace is basically weaving on a circular loom. There are a few basic steps: create the loom, warp the loom, weave portions and do any other decorative stitching, and finally secure the outer edge with a row of coral knots. This will all be covered in class. Students can choose to work with a weight of thread that suits them, from #20 crochet cotton to #80 tatting thread. Heavier thread is preferred for the first try. Metallics are challenging and not recommended. A tapestry needle that fits the thread is needed as well as a small sewing needle.



Class Fee: \$135
